



The 30th Infantry Division Association's 2009 National Reunion A Great Success!



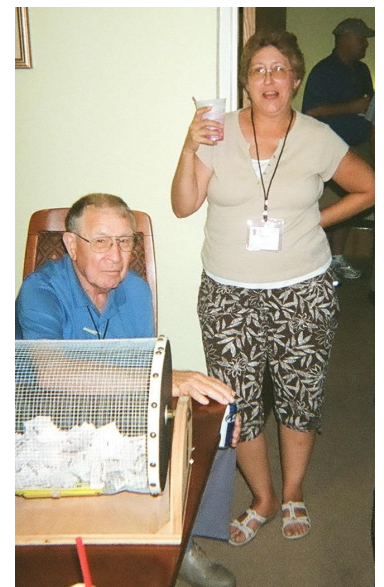

30th Infantry Division and 30th Heavy Brigade Combat Team Hold A Memorial Ceremony

On Thursday, August 20, 2009, North Carolina Gov. Bev Perdue, Congressman Larry Kissell (NC-08), and Maj. Gen. William E. Ingram, Jr., the Adjutant General of the N.C. National Guard, assembled in the Old Senate Chamber on the Second Floor of the N.C. State Capitol Building to give a final salute and to pay tribute to four fallen 30th Brigade soldiers and their families. SFC Edward Kramer, SGT Juan Baldeosingh, SGT Roger Adams and SPC Robert Bittiker were killed in action on 29 June 2009 when their vehicle struck a Improvised Explosive Device south of Mahmudiyah, Iraq. The memorial ceremony will also be attended by WWII veterans of the 30th Infantry Division Association who are holding their annual national reunion here in Raleigh. All the attendees assembled in the Old Senate Chamber in the State Capitol at 2:30 p.m. for the ceremony and then moved to the World War II Memorial outside on the Capitol grounds for the placing of a wreath.

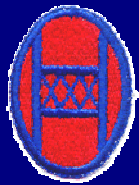


OHA Honors A Member's Dad With Military Honors "He Earned Them"

A Memorial and Interment Service was scheduled for Jay Callaham's Dad, Jack M. Callaham, for 11:00 AM Thursday morning 30 July at the National Cemetery in Salisbury, NC. Jack M. Callaham was drafted shortly after graduating from High School in Charlotte, NC in 1943. He was assigned to the Combat Engineers and served in the European Theater in C Company, 202nd Engineer Combat Battalion. He helped to build the first pontoon bridge across the Rhine and was involved in numerous operations earning the Rhineland and Central Europe service stars for his EAME Service Medal.

In recent months, Mr. Callaham, had experienced failing health and Jay put us on notice that we might be called upon to provide military honors for his Dad's Memorial and Interment Service. Jay said his Dad was not one for making much of a fuss and made it clear that he wanted no viewings or formal funeral service. The only thing that he did ask for was to be cremated and that his remains be buried with his WWII comrades. "I want to do as he wished - but with military honors," said Jay, "He earned them."

Jay finally had to inform the OHA that their services would now be needed. We were all very saddened by the news but were able to muster eleven OHA members to execute the military honors that Jack Callaham earned and deserved. Bob Guerrin did a magnificent job as the services Chaplain, the Color Guard consisted of Walt Sowinski, Neil Trivette, FJ Hale and Oliver Hyatt. The firing Party was lead by Mark Burfete and consisted of Don Shupe, Robbie Lamb, Mike Owens, Ken Hyatt and Clint Yarbrough. A very touching moment for all of us was when Jay Callaham stepped forward to perform as the Bugler and then proceeded to sound Taps for his Dad.



120th Remembers Fallen Comrades



On July 5, members of the 1st Battalion (Combined Arms) 120th Infantry gathered at FOB (Forward Operating Base) Mahmudiyah to give a final salute to four fallen comrades. **SFC Edward Kramer, SGT Juan Baldeosingh, SGT Roger Adams and SPC Robert Bittiker** were killed in action on 29 June 2009 when their vehicle struck a Improvised Explosive Device south of Mahmudiyah, Iraq. The soldiers were all members of 1st Platoon, Alpha Company, 120th Infantry. Two of the soldiers, SFC Kramer and SPC Bittiker were on their second combat tour with OLD HICKORY and the 120th Infantry.

LTC Jack Mellott, the Battalion Commander reminded the audience, "We will always remember our fallen brothers. They join a long line of 120th soldiers who have made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and their brothers. When the history of the war in

Iraq is completed, it will likely not mention most of the men who fought and died here, including SFC Kramer, SGT Baldeosingh, SGT Adams and SPC Bittiker. That is our job, to keep their memory alive and honor their sacrifice. History will mention all the great things that we have done for the people of Iraq. That is the tribute others will pay to the lives of these and other fine soldiers."

In his comments, CPT Chris Padgett, Commander of Alpha Company reminded his soldiers to continue mission. "Not for fame or reward, not for place or for rank. Not lured by ambition or goaded by necessity, but in simple obedience to duty. Wolverines, follow me. I will meet you on the objective!"

The ceremony was closed by the rendering of honors by the entire Battalion and other guests. Alpha Company led the way and was followed by several hundred other fellow 120th soldiers. Everyday now, soldiers continue to roll out on patrol and mission to finish the mission and honor the memory and sacrifice of our fallen brothers. Fathers, sons, and citizen-soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice when duty called.

120th Soldiers Awarded OLD HICKORY Combat Patch



For only the third time in the regimental history of the 120th, soldiers of the 1st Battalion (Combined Arms) 120th Infantry were awarded combat patches for service in a declared combat zone. This system was introduced during World War II and that generation of OLD HICKORY was the first to don the patch of the 30th on its right sleeve for former wartime service. Since World War II, soldiers of the 30th Heavy Brigade Combat Team have been awarded the patch twice, once in June 2004 and again on 25 July 2009 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Mellott and CSM Prince awarded each Company Commander and First Sergeant their OLD HICKORY combat patches. We hope all is well with ya'll and the OHA. Here's just a short update on the 120th: 1st Battalion (Combined Arms) 120th Infantry assumed control of OE (operational environment) Tuskhog on 25 May 2008 at FOB Mahmudiyah, Iraq. Just south of Baghdad, the area is a mix of rural and urban areas that lie between the Tigris and Euphrates River. Soldiers of the battalion will conduct full spectrum operations in full partnership with the Iraqi Security Forces and local civilian governments to maintain security and enable civil capacity. This can be a complex operating environment but the soldiers of the Tuskhog Battalion are up to the task. On 13 June, soldiers will earn their 30th combat patch for serving thirty consecutive days in a declared combat zone. The Battalion chose 13 June as our date due to the 120th Infantry coming ashore at Normandy on that day in 1944. We have a pretty good Battalion headquarters, hard stand building just right for decorating. My Battalion Commander would like to get some pictures of the 120th from WWI and WWII and put'em up on the wall here in our TOC. He wants the soldiers to know and connect with the rich history of this regiment. I will sure miss the reunion this year. Look forward to making the next. Give my best to the gang. Another Fine Man, A Good And Loyal Friend Is Gone



Herbert Lucas passed away on May 22, 2009. His daughter, Marilyn Lucas, wrote to tell us that Herb was gone and that we should pass the word on to all his friends and buddies in the 30th IDA. Herbert Lucas, 90, of the Springfield Residence, formerly of Chestnut Hill, is a decorated World War II veteran, who was wounded while fighting with the Army's 30th Infantry Division during the Normandy campaign. He was discharged at the rank of Captain and was awarded a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star. After his military service, Mr. Lucas worked for the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and retired after 31 years as a cost analyst for the U.S. Department of Defense. He is survived by two daughters, Sharon L. Wilkes and Marilyn Lucas, and five grandchildren. Mr. Lucas was preceded in death by his wife, the former Mary Abraham, and a daughter, Bonnie J. Lucas. A graveside service with full military honors will be held at 9 a.m., Thursday, August 13, at Arlington National Cemetery. Butner Live Fire Training Weekend

This is a maximum effort for the OHA! We will be holding our Annual Fall Live Fire this October 9,10,11, 2009. This event which is designed to provide the membership with an opportunity to fire their WWII era infantry weapons that most of us tote to various display or tactical events. We always hold this live fire event on a Saturday and as customary, it will be administered in a strictly professional and well organized manner. The "qualification shoot" will use live ball ammunition and the Range Officer will work hard to direct the event (to the best of his ability) per WWII U.S. Army range regulations.

Over the years, we've had exceptional participation by our members as well as other invited living history groups We are going to try to restore that past performance this year. **Ken Hyatt will be the POC** for this event and he's asked all of us to help him get "competition to shoot against. I'm sure you remember our "unofficial competitions" based on high score that we used to put into play ... you remember when the only award was being the high score unit so's you'd have braggin' rights.

On Sunday, the short range will be opened up so the participants could try out and live fire some of their other military weapons. Usually, these weapons consisted of WWII rifles, carbines, pistols, shotguns and maybe some full auto's. The short range live fire event was somewhat informal compared to the long range although it was still subject to and under the control of a Range Officer.

The world class OHA mess crew will again try to produce edible, period foodstuffs (at a reasonable cost to the membership) so we don't have to go off base any more than necessary. In the past, this function was handled as a "catered" affair which we all enjoyed but then the OHA decided to give it a go and do it ourselves! The mess crew's motto of "**Death From Within**" is a well known motto and is highly feared by other living history units...both Allied as well as the Axis units!

So why not sign up now so you can relive the experience of those past days ... days when canteen cups were filled with superb hot java, mess kits were heaped with steaming hot GI slop, friendship flourished, cigars were lit and we all sat around and bragged about our high scores and our fine Garands! When: 1200 hrs 9 October 2009 to 1500 hrs 11 October 2009

This is a pre-registration, invitation only event. No freelancers allowed.

Facilities: We will be in Kitchen area C. This is a bivouac event. If your unit has period tentage, bring it for your members to use.

Ranges: The KD range will be used for the shoot on Saturday. **Sunday** is the only day that sub-guns or machine guns will be fired.

Cost: There is one event package available- **\$35.00**. Friday supper, lunch for Saturday and Sunday **will be on your own** at the range

Meals included are: Saturday breakfast and supper, Sunday breakfast. Price includes all range and kitchen area charges.

Check In: On arrival, immediately report to the orderly room to sign in and turn in ammo. Morning formation will be at 0800 hrs on Saturday and Sunday.

Registration check in will open at 1200 hrs. Friday and will close at 0930 hrs. Saturday.

What to bring:

- A minimum of 60 rounds is needed for the course of fire on Saturday.
- All ammo should be in a period container tagged with your name and will be turned in at registration.
- Bring mess gear for Friday dinner, and Saturday and Sunday breakfast. Immersion heaters will be available for cleaning mess gear.
- Any non-period articles must be kept out of sight.
- This event will happen rain or shine. Come prepared.
- Bring a ground cloth for the range and **hearing protection**.

Rules for the event:

- If you do not attend the safety training session at 0930 hours Saturday, you will not be allowed to shoot.
- No one under 18 is allowed to participate in the shoot.
- No pets, children or significant others.
- All participants must be in World War II uniforms.
- **Only World War II service rifles are allowed for the match on Saturday.** No submachine guns or automatic rifles are to be used for the shoot on Saturday.
- Violation of OHA Code of Conduct or Range Safety Rules could result in expulsion from the Camp Butner Training Site.
- **Class III weapons must have proper paperwork.** Use address at top of 1st page.
- Appearance shall be in accordance with WWII military standards including haircuts.

For OHA members:

- We will set up our GP medium for OHA members. OHA members should bring cots and period bedding.
- All rifles will be kept in the orderly room.
- Uniform of the day for Saturday will be OD's with leggings, cartridge belt, First Aid pouch, and canteen with helmets. Bring soft cover. Friday's and Sunday's uniform can be fatigues or OD's.
- OHA members are expected to attend as 30th ID.

Directions: Take I-85 to exit 189, proceed into Butner. Stay on Central Ave. for 3.1 miles. At the concrete water tower bear to the right. You will come to a stop sign at 33rd St. Take a left and you will immediately come to another stop sign at Old Route 75. At Old Route 75 take a left for 0.4 miles and make a right turn on to Range Rd. Proceed 1.9 miles. Turn right onto Robert Chapel Rd. Look for Range Control HQ building on left. Take left at the range HQ. Take first right, then next left, then right. Kitchen C will be on your right.
